



I created the Crawl Shawl to celebrate the first Long Island Yarn Crawl. I wanted to make something easy enough for a novice knitter but with enough going on to keep a more experienced knitter's interest. This triangle shawl is worked in bands of stockinette and garter stitch that complement the great color changes created by the Noro Kibou yarn.

Materials:

Yarn: 2 skeins of Noro Kibou (54% Cotton, 34% Wool, 12% Silk 297 yd [270 m], 100g), sample shown in color 8

Needles: Size 8-32" circular needle

Tools: 4 stitch markers, large tapestry needle to weave in ends

Gauge:

3.25 stitches and 4.5 rows per inch in stockinette

Finished Dimensions: 62" x 25"

Pattern:

Cast on 7 stitches using knitted cast on.

Section 1:

Row 1 (first repeat)- K2, pm, YO, K1, YO, pm, K1, pm, YO, K1, YO, pm, K2 (11 sts).

Row 1 (subsequent repeats)- K2, sm, YO knit to marker, YO, sm, K1, sm, YO, knit to marker, YO, sm, K2.

Row 2 and all even row until row 20 – K2, purl to last 2 sts, K2.

Row 3 and all odd rows – K2, sm, YO knit to marker, YO, sm, K1, sm, YO, knit to marker, YO, sm, K2.

After row 21, your pattern will slightly change to a garter section.

Section 2: Garter section

Rows 22 and all even rows to row 30- K2, sm, knit to marker, sm, p1, sm , knit to end of row.

Row 23 and all odd rows to row 29 – K2, sm, YO, knit to marker, YO, K2, sm, YO knit to marker, YO, sm, K1, sm, YO, knit to marker, YO, sm, K2.

Repeat rows 1-30 a total of 4 times (247 stitches).

Repeat rows 1-25 once more.

Bind off
